The Grape and Grain website listed the head of the Hop Growers Association, Stewart Ferguson as a supplier. Unfortunately Stewart is no longer supplying Rhizomes. This may be the reason that Grumpy's are also no longer offering Rhizomes for sale.

Brewers Choice: http://brewerschoice.net.au/ offer rhizomes but they have sold out for this year !!!

After further searching, an ebayer seller HOPSWEST occasionally pops up with rhizomes.

An alternative is to search forums like Aussie Homebrewer: www.aussiehomebrewer.com And contact brewers who are happy to make their rhizomes available.

Brew giants John Palmer and Jamil Zainasheff on board for ANHC 08

Two of the biggest names in craft brewing will headline the inaugural Australian National Hombrewing Conference in Melbourne later this year.

John Palmer and Jamil Zainasheff—beer authors, broadcasters, and aficionados in the extreme—have both confirmed they'll travel from the US to deliver keynote presentations at the conference, October 23-25, 2008.

Just in case you're not entirely familiar with John and Jamil's work—here's some more information:

Best known for his book How To Brewrequired reading for anyone considering brewing beer at home - John Palmer has been brewing and writing for about 15 years, and continues to be an active member of the home brewing community.

John likes to investigate the processes of brewing, and has written many articles for Brew Your Own and Zymurgy magazines, and given presentations on topics like: malt analysis and extraction, mash enzymes and fermentability, water chemistry and pH adjustment.

Another giant of craft brew literature, Jamil Zainasheff may just be one of the world's most successful competition homebrewers.

Since winning his first gold medal at the American National Homebrewing Competition in 2002, Jamil has continued to rack up the medals and has taken out the Ninkasi Award (for best all-round brewer) in 2004 and 2007.

He has won gold medals for styles as diverse as Scottish 80/-, and Flemish Red... (twice!)

Jamil is also well-known for his work on The Brewing Network, where he broadcasts the Jamil Show with Jon Plise. On top of that, he is a member of the American Homebrewer's Association Governing Committee and an appointed officer of the BJCP. He also writes for Zymurgy and Brew Your Own magazines and has his own website at www.mmalty.com.

Jamil has also co-authored the new book *Brewing Classic Styles: 80 Winning Recipes Anyone Can Brew* with John Palmer.


